On completion of this course, the learner should be able to:

1. Describe the characteristics of life-threatening illness and injury in children.

3. Identify the most frequent causes of illness or injury in children.
4. Describe the assessment of pediatric patients with illness or injury.
5. Plan the specific interventions needed to manage the pediatric patient with illness or injury.
6. Evaluate the effectiveness of nursing interventions related to patient outcomes.
7. Identify health promotion strategies related to the pediatric population.

On completion of the psychomotor skill station, the learner should be able to:

1. Demonstrate a standardized, systematic, and organized approach to assessment, planning, interventions, and evaluation.
2. Perform a primary and secondary assessment.
3. Identify an appropriate plan of care.
4. Set priorities for nursing interventions based on assessment data.
